## PLAYGROUP EXPECTATIONS

In line with the Early Years Learning Framework and Dominican's core values, it is everyone's responsibility to create a culture of respect, service and learning. We can teach and model these attributes to our children through the following expectations:

- 1. <u>Safe hands</u> and <u>kind words</u> should be reinforced and encouraged when interacting with peers and adults. <u>Manners</u> such as 'please' and 'thank you' are greatly appreciated. When having a conversation and listening to instructions, <u>eye-contact</u> is an important listening tool. Children learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect.
- 2. The playgroup coordinator's commitment is to plan and facilitate <u>inclusive and engaging</u> learning opportunities for all the children and it is the parent's/carer's responsibility to <u>monitor</u> their own child's behaviour by modelling <u>respect</u> for themselves, others and the environment. Children should feel safe, secure and supported
  - 3. Having a <u>clean and tidy learning space</u> is vital for children to feel a sense of <u>connection</u>, so it is important for parents/carers to assist and support their child in resetting the learning environment after each session. Children become socially responsible and show respect for the environment.
