We are the Year 6 Justice Leaders at Dominican School and we are passionate about working for Justice for our Earth. Part of our role is to work with our school to care for our environment. At Dominican, we are committed to caring for our common home. We are inspired by our Pope and his letter, Laudato Si, to work together to make a positive difference to care for creation and reduce our environmental footprint. We have nude food lunchboxes, class indoor and outdoor environmental responsibilities, butterfly, flower and veggie gardens, and Friday whole school yard clean-ups after lunch. We have also reviewed and developed our waste management processes to dispose of our waste better using recycling, organic, paper and landfill bins... and have less of them.

An area we'd like to GROW is in COMPOSTING. Currently we put our food scraps into our green organic waste bins kept in our school corridors. We tip the food scraps into our large green bins and once a fortnight the council collects them. We want to change and improve what we're doing here so that we reduce, reuse and recycle our food waste to compost and put back into our gardens.

As a group, we are keen to learn more about how to compost, so that we can develop a process for us to recycle our food scraps to use in our garden. We want to educate all our classes so that they can get involved and invite our parents and families to help out. We'd really love to see our herbs, fruits and veggies grow so that we can use them to cook in our school kitchen.

Our HOPE is that we can get this started and promote this with our school community so that together we can learn and act to make positive change for our school environment.
