Two weeks ago I attended this year's South Australian Catholic Primary Principal Association (SACPPA) conference, which was centred on the compelling theme, "Leading a High Performance Culture Now and Into the Future." The event brought together visionary educators and thought leaders to explore innovative strategies for fostering a culture of high performance within schools, ensuring that students receive the best possible education and support for their futures.

All leaders left with a renewed sense of purpose and a toolkit of strategies to implement in their schools. The discussions underscored that leading a high-performance culture is not a one-time effort but an ongoing commitment to excellence, adaptability, and innovation.

The SACPPA conference once again proved to be a pivotal event for educational leaders, providing us with the insights and inspiration needed to lead our schools effectively now and into the future. Together, all Catholic leaders are poised to make a lasting impact, ensuring that South Australian Catholic primary schools remain beacons of high performance and holistic education.

Last week we celebrated National Reconciliation Week. National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The 2024 theme, 'Now More Than Ever'. Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

#### **JAPANESE**

Language is interconnected with culture and our students are learning not only the Japanese language but also culture.

We are excited to continue building upon these foundational skills and nurturing a love for physical activity and movement.


