

PULSE CHECK IN SURVEY

During Weeks 5 and 6 each term, students from R-12 in all catholic schools participate in a wellbeing check in survey called the Pulse Check Survey. The survey was designed to provide information about how students are currently feeling about school, to help them become 'thriving people, capable learners and leaders for the world God desires.' The Pulse survey asks students 8 questions about their feelings of belonging, safety and their learning. Students are asked to respond with 'most of the time', 'sometimes' and 'not very often'. In Year 4-6 students have the opportunity to add extra information about their responses. At Dominican School after each survey, classroom teachers have a 1:1 conversation with students if they have answered with a 'not very often' response to help them to gain a deeper understanding of why they were feeling this way during the survey. It is important to note that the Pulse Survey is just one way our school educators gain information on our student's wellbeing.
